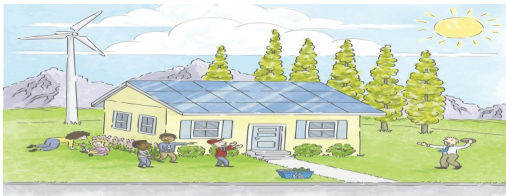


If you receive LIHEAP, you may be eligible for the following:

- Low Income Assistance (LIAP) provides assistance to residential customers of Central Maine Power and Madison Electric. If found eligible, households will receive a one time credit on their electric bill.
- Telephone Assistance Program (TAP) provides a \$15.28 monthly credit on your telephone bill. If the LIHEAP recipient does not have a telephone, service can be installed, at a discounted rate.
- SafeLink Wireless Program is a government supported program that provides a free cell phone and free airtime minutes each month to qualifying customers. If you receive: LIHEAP, Food Stamps, Medicaid/MainCare, SS income or TANF you may qualify. If you have a lifeline program on your home phone, you do not qualify for the cell phone program.

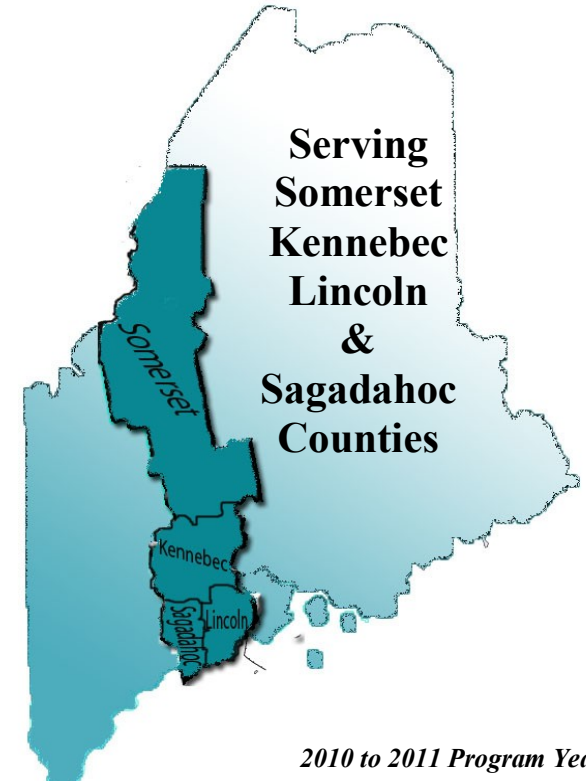

DESCRIPTION OF ENERGY & HOME SERVICES PROGRAMS

Please note not all programs are available in all Counties

Central Heating Improvement Program (CHIP) - For homeowners, designed to repair or replace non-working or condemned heating systems.

Department Of Energy/HEAP WZ (DOE/HTZ) - Provides services such as insulating, weather-stripping, caulking, etc.

Emergency Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) - Provides emergency heating assistance one time per year.

Families In Transition (FIT) - Provides subsidized apartments to homeless and at-risk families, along with supportive services.

Housing Services - Provides pre-purchase counseling/education , post purchase counseling, foreclosure intervention, lending and real estate development.

Low Income Assistance Program (LIAP) - If found eligible, provides assistance to residential customers of Central Maine Power and Madison Electric.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) - Provides a heating assistance credit one time per heating season.

Rehab Services - For Community Development Block Grant projects, job specifications, award construction bids, complete inspections and maintain rehab records.

Telephone Assistance Program (TAP) - Provides a monthly credit and/or assistance with connection of a telephone.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) - Acts as a liaison for food banks and soup kitchens in Kennebec and Somerset counties.

Appliance Replacement Program (ARP) - If found eligible, replaces energy inefficient refrigerators, freezers and light bulbs with Energy Star Rated ones.
