\$20K Grant from Ronald McDonald House Charities of Maine Supports Head Start Children

More than 350 Head Start children have begun receiving preventive dental care thanks to a \$20,000 grant from Ronald McDonald House Charities. The grant was one of three recently given by RMHC of Maine to organizations seeking to improve children's oral health. These funds will purchase the equipment and supplies needed to provide on-site dental care to children age 1-5 who attend KVCAP Head Start programs.

Waterville Community Dental Center has partnered with KVCAP for more than a decade to bring dental services and oral health education to children in Head Start programs who otherwise would not receive dental care. Teams comprised of a dentist, a hygienist and support staff began visiting Head Start sites in September, and visits will continue through early December before restarting in the spring.
