Health & safety risks were repaired in 122 homes.

34 seniors lived at the newly renovated Gerald Hotel affordable housing project.

The Family Enrichment Council works to **prevent child abuse** and neglect in Kennebec and Somerset counties.

4,000 kids took part in personal body safety classes.



Maine Families Home Visiting works in partnership with expectant parents and parents of babies and toddlers to ensure safe home environments and promote healthy growth and development.



341 families were connected with a home visitor.

100% of children were up-to-date on their immunizations.

87% of pregnant moms received adequate prenatal care.
