Mark K. Johnston

This event is held in memory of Mark K. Johnston, who passed away in October of 2018 at the age of 64.

Mark joined KVCAP in 1997 and was an integral part of our Senior Management team for 21 years. Mark was first hired as KVCAP's Youth Build Director and was quickly promoted to Chief Financial Officer. In this position, he oversaw all aspects of finance, information technology, and facilities.



Mark played a major role in the development of numerous projects, including the Gerald Hotel senior housing project, Cony Village, and the construction of Educare Central Maine.

Mark loved working for KVCAP and believed wholeheartedly in our mission – to help people and families living in poverty become more economically stable. His work in community action was far reaching and his gift for creating lasting friendships extended throughout Maine, New England, and beyond. Outside of work, Mark was also devoted to various local community organizations including the Boy Scouts of America, the Genesis Community Loan Fund in Bath, and the Richmond Area Health Center.

Most of all, Mark loved spending time with his family, friends, and colleagues. He enjoyed golfing, snowmobiling, the Red Sox, and attending his grandsons' sporting events. Mark was known best for his love of boating.

The close friendships that he forged during his career at KVCAP were extensive. Mark was well known for his generosity, humor, genuine smile, and kind heart. He was a remarkable man and is deeply missed by many.

Golf Rules

FORMAT: Four person scramble tournament. All golf rules shall conform to USGA Rules

GOLF ETIQUETTE:

- 1. Please smooth all marks made in Sand Bunkers.
- 2. Leave the putting green as soon as you have holed out.
- 3. Do not play until the players in front of you are out of range.
- 4. Balls may be cleaned on the green and ball marks repaired prior to putting. You may not repair spike marks prior to putting.
- 5. Please observe all local course rules.
- 6. Enjoy the day and your fellowship with other golfers!

RULES: These rules are subject to change/updating prior to the start of the tournament.

- 1. A scramble means that all team members tee off on each hole and then decide which tee shot they like the best and mark the spot with a tee or ball marker.
- 2. The other team members pick up their balls and place them within one club length (no closer to the hole) of the marked spot. Each team member hits their next shot from the chosen spot of the prior shot.
- 3. If the ball you choose to play is in a hazard (sand, etc.), the rough, or out of bounds, you cannot drop the ball outside of the hazard or rough even if relief is within one club length away.
- 4. This procedure is followed on every shot for the remainder of the hole, including putts. The ball should be marked on the putting green also.
- 5. Each player per team is allowed to use two Mulligans or "doovers." You may use one in the front nine and one in the back nine. They can be used in the tee box, the fairway, or the green.
- 6. Putts need to be made within 3 inches of the marked spot (no closer to the hole). The first ball to go in the hole is counted for the team score. When putting, once any ball is holed out, no further strokes count. The team is cautioned not to make "tap" in putts until all team members have had the opportunity to attempt the team's original putt.

Golf Rules

- 7. Each player's tee shot must be used at least two times during the 18-hole competition.
- 8. Men tee off from the gold tees and women from the green tees.
- 9. Threesomes are permitted to rotate a fourth shot from each ball location. In other words, one person will be hitting twice from each position. However, the person hitting two shots cannot do so consecutively. (For example, it's Player A's turn to hit two shots. The other team members must play their ball in between Player A's two shots.)
 - a. The rotation should be set at the beginning of the round and remain constant throughout.
 - b. An example of this would be:
 - 1. Hole 1 shot 1: ABCA
 - 2. Hole 1 shot 2: BCAB
 - 3. Hole 1 shot 3: CABC
 - 4. Hole 1 shot 4: ABCA
 - 5. Hole 2 shot 1: BCAB
- 10. In the event of a 5 person team. Only 4 are allowed to tee off and play each hole. Members must rotate with one person sitting out each hole. (For example, if rotating Players A – E with A playing the first hole and Player E sitting out, Player A, would sit out on holes 2, 7, 12, 17. Player B would sit out holes 3, 8, 13, 18 and so on.)
- 11. In the case of a tie, Lakewood staff will compare the score card of the teams that have tied starting with the hole with the highest handicap and moving to the hole with the lowest handicap, continuing until one team has the lowest score on a hole.
