WHAT IS KIDS FIRST?

Kids First is a one day, four hour workshop which is designed to help parents address problems and promote reduction of the negative effects of divorce.

The workshop will address:

- Children's needs as marital and family roles change
- The effects of divorce on children and children's reaction to divorce
- Making decisions about parenting arrangements
- Dealing with conflict without involving children
- Helping children adjust to differences between households

Participants are encouraged to attend the program as early in the separation or divorce process as possible.
