### 3. Grant Planning and Financial Overview

The Policy Council reviewed and discussed at length the outcomes of the Child & Family Services Self-Assessments, updates to the Community Assessment (i.e. pandemic impacts), results of the Family Survey, and preliminary Budget Forecasting.

#### **Self-Assessment Summary**

Self-Assessments were completed in all six content areas; Disabilities, Education, Family Services, Health, Mental Health, and Nutrition. Numerous strengths were recognized. Great discussion ensued and they identified the top three areas of focus, highlighting the top 2 for the upcoming year.

1st Recruitment of eligible children/families (impacts funding)

2<sup>nd</sup> Staffing design for safety and quality (tied to staff, child and parent mental health, family services)

3<sup>rd</sup> Food; Maintain Food Pantry, promote WIC and SNAP benefits

More discussion will occur next month over level of quality (staffing) and quantity (locations) as services are matched with available funding.

### **Community Assessment Updates**

#### National:

Pandemic impact on employment, education and mental health

- Recognition that childcare is an economic development issue and a necessary part of infrastructure
- American Rescue Plan and the nation's response to early care and education

#### State:

- Governor's Economic Recovery Plan includes a focus on childcare as part of the path forward
- Supports for childcare/pre-school and partnerships
- Improved systems alignment efforts

#### Community:

- Employment opportunities impacted due to closures and part-time service positions
- Decreased Department of Education Child count means reduced program funding
- Head Start Eligibility challenges, especially with working families

#### Family Survey Focus Areas

Policy Council members reviewed results of the Family Survey. Extremely positive feedback. Two areas of focus include:

- 1. Continue efforts to support parent to parent connections
- 2. Remain focused on social/emotional support

### Financial Overview/Budget Forecast

Anne Owens, Program Director of Business & Information, joined Policy Council to share an overview of the Business & Information department: financials, contracts, grants, data, marketing, and administrative supports. She provided a financial overview of Child & Family Services, including an in depth analysis of the program's current budget projections as well as the budget forecast for next program year; noting the projected deficit of revenue due to the reduction of Department of Education funding and child care revenue. Through management assessment and the Strategic Planning process, the program will continue to review ways to reduce the deficit. Recommendations will be reviewed by Policy Council and the KVCAP Board of Directors in April for finalization of the Head Start Federal grants, due by June 1<sup>st</sup>.
