

Residential Energy Auditor

KVCAP's Energy Program has an opening for a Residential Energy Auditor to work in Kennebec, Somerset, Sagadahoc and Lincoln counties. The person in this position is responsible for providing audits which include assessing clients' housing needs; estimating and overseeing work for HEAP/Weatherization, DOE and other associated programs. This person also provides clients with education about energy conservation and other housing-related issues.

<u>Requirements</u>: Must hold or obtain Building Analyst Certification (BPI) and LEAD-RRP Initial certification. At least five years related work experience and/or equivalent training in the housing and energy field. Working knowledge of residential carpentry, energy conservation, weatherization techniques, local and state building codes, heating systems and rehab techniques, preferably with hands-on experience. Experience with project estimating and management in the construction trades; ability to lift and carry 65lb blower door; ability to communicate positively with a variety of people; self motivated, possess computer skills and ability to work with minimum supervision. Must have a valid driver's license insured to the State of Maine requirements and ability to travel in four county area. Ability to pass DHHS, DMV, SBI, Fraud and Sex Offender Registry background checks.

KVCAP benefits include paid holidays, bi-weekly accrual of paid time off, participation in an employer sponsored retirement plan, choices of health, life, dental, vision and disability insurance options.
