# **Children & Youth**

Head Start ■ Early Head Start ■ Educare Central Maine ■ Child Care

**559** children (birth-age 5) increased their readiness for school success through **425,380** hours of early care and education.

Children ate **13,968** healthy meals and snacks.

Community child care providers received over **400** hours of training and technical support.

The South End Teen Center had **48** members. Teens participated in community service projects, music lessons, cooking classes, gardening, homework and tutoring, and other enriching activities.

**937** summer meals for school-aged children and youth were distributed in the South End neighborhood, in partnership with the Alfond Youth & Community Center and Waterville Public Schools.

# **Families**

Maine Families Home Visiting partners with expecting or new parents to ensure safe home environments and promote healthy growth and development.

227 families participated in the program. 260 in-home visits,1,304 virtual visits and 688 phone visits were conducted.





The Family Enrichment Councils work to prevent child abuse & neglect in Kennebec and Somerset counties.

**1,300** caregivers participated in parenting classes.

Since March 2020, families received **56,000** free diapers.

# Transportation

The Kennebec & Somerset public transit buses gave **30,589** rides bringing people to work, school, health care and to access local businesses and services.

KV Van and volunteer drivers provided nearly **119,000** rides bringing people to health-related appointments, driving **2.6 million** miles.

**8%** of trips were for dialysis and cancer treatments.

# For the Home

**7,734** households received fuel assistance, keeping **16,170** people warm.

318 people had their furnace serviced or replaced.40 households received Home Repair services.

Affordable housing development of **30** senior apartments continued in Hartland.

In partnership with Maine Housing, we continued to implement the Emergency Rental Relief Program assisting **3,879** households with rent and utility payments while putting **\$9.2m** 



back into the economy.

We helped **366** people to quarantine safely due to COVID-19 by delivering food, medication, cleaning supplies and other basic needs.

## Resource Navigators connected **804** people to a variety of services through one-time visits and longer-term case management.
