## 4. Family Engagement

#### **KVCAP** Board Update

- Mary Street affordable housing apartment leases are filling, with a few more available.
- New Somerset program for transportation is in the works. This is an Uber like model.
- An effort is being made to change bus routes because of empty seats.
- Pre-K children are needing transportation in several programs. MSAD#54 Skowhegan is exploring district transportation in the future.
- Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Accessibility (DEIA) survey results are currently being collected.

• Mary-Gene plans to attend the Maine Community Action Partners summit.

## Child & Family Services Chief Operating Officer Report

- 1. Program Information Summary Report
  - Budget a reminder that Carry Over funds have been discussed. EHS-CCP funds would exceed the \$250,000 threshold and require a Budget Revision. Tracye provided the following considerations to spend down the remaining amount:
    - 1. Funding teacher salaries and benefits increased costs
    - **2.** Opening up another classroom, at North Elementary School or Educare, also exploring Kennebec Valley Community College campus.
    - 3. Natural Playgrounds for EHS:CCP partners
    - **4.** Skowhegan new school natural playgrounds and porches for safety egress (\$200,000).
- 2. Enrollment Report
  - Possible merge of part day classes to open up an infant toddler room to reduce waitlist.
  - Lost 14 staff since spring and rehired half. Impacts staff training needs.
  - Transportation is a cause of under- enrollment.
